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TIPS FOR A SUCCESSFUL RETURN TO COLLEGE

Planning to return to college may seem overwhelming, but there are many ways to prepare. Use these tips to get ready for a successful college comeback.

- 1 Identify your why. Clear reasons for finishing college can help you stay motivated.
 - Students return to school for many different reasons. Identifying your goals can help you identify the program, modality, and timeline that works best for you.
 - To identify your why, write a list of your reasons for pursuing higher education. Here are some to help get you started: improve career and salary prospects, make a better future for your children, personal satisfaction, achieve a lifelong goal, etc.
- 2 Pick your path. If you're looking to finish the degree you started or complete a degree that's closely related to your past college course work, find the best path to get you there!
 - Match your career goals to the degree or certificate program that can get you there. EKU Online provides more than 100 affordable undergraduate, graduate, doctoral and certificate programs delivered in a convenient, online format.
 - A General Studies degree is a great option for students who have some college credit but have not yet earned a degree. You can transfer up to 90 credit hours toward your degree at EKU Online.
 - Meet with an advisor to determine which courses you need to finish your degree based on your academic transcript and the university catalog. Your advisor can help you develop a personalized graduation plan that will help you achieve your goals.

- Complete the FAFSA to see if you are eligible for help paying for college. Always submit a FAFSA, even if you don't think you will qualify for aid.
- Apply for grants and scholarship opportunities. Take the time to apply for any scholarship or grant for which you are eligible.
- If you are currently employed, you may be eligible for help from your employer. Check with your HR office to determine if your company offers education or tuition benefits.
- Take advantage of our payment plan option, which allows you to pay your tuition bill in monthly installments.

4 - Plan your success. Embrace your fresh start with a detailed plan for success when classes start.

- Plan your schedule. Time management is key for a successful college career, so be sure to schedule regular time for classwork each week. Be realistic in your scheduling and ruthless in removing obstacles from your path.

How do I re-apply for admission?

APPLICATION PROCESS

Undergraduate Students:

Step 1: Fill out the free online application:

START MY APPLICATION

Step 2: Submit your high school transcripts to the Office of Admissions (if not already on file).

Step 3: Submit ACT or SAT scores (not required but encouraged for determining appropriate course placement).

Graduate Students:

Step 1: Fill out the free online application:

START MY APPLICATION

Step 2: Provide official entrance exam scores (GRE, MAT or GMAT), if applicable.

Step 3: Provide official undergraduate transcripts (if not an EKU graduate).

STUDENT CLEARING HOUSE

Step 4: Submit letters of recommendation, if required for the academic program.

Step 5: Some programs may have additional application requirements. Contact your enrollment advisor to learn of any specific requirements for your program.

Do I need to re-submit my high school or college transcripts?

Transcripts remain on file at EKU for 5 years. If you attended another institution after you last attended EKU, you will need to submit transcripts from that institution.
